

UPPER SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS

2009-2010

- In the Class of 2010, five students received National Merit Scholarships, one student received a National Merit Special Scholarship, 10 students were named National Merit Finalists and 13 were named National Merit Commended Students. One student received a National Achievement Scholarship.
- Seventy-one percent of the members of the Class of 2010 took at least one Advanced Placement examination, achieving a mean score of 4.25 on a 5-point scale on 332 examinations taken during their Upper School years. Already, 55 percent of the members of the Class of 2011 have taken at least one Advanced Placement examination, achieving a mean score of 4.50 on a 5-point scale on the examinations taken by the end of their junior year.
- Members of the Class of 2010 were offered approximately 95 merit-based scholarships worth approximately \$3.6 million.
- The average SAT score for the Class of 2010 was more than 400 points above the 2009 national average among college-bound students.
- The Upper School chemistry team placed first in the UNC-C Super Competition.
- Ninety-eight Upper School students were named All-Conference athletes and 53 were named All-State athletes during the 2009-2010 school year.
- The Varsity athletic teams' cumulative win record during the 2009-2010 school year enabled them to win the Wachovia Cup for the sixth consecutive year.
- Upper School students won regional and national awards in the 2010 Scholastic Art Competition and writing awards, including a National American Voices Medal (writing), two National Gold Medals (writing), two National Silver Medals (writing), and an American Vision Award (art).
- Upper School students contributed 12,857 hours of community service during the school year.
- Twenty-five Upper School students were inducted into the Cum Laude Society, which is an academic honor society modeled after Phi Beta Kappa.
- One Latin senior received the prestigious Jefferson Scholarship, which covers tuition, room and board, books, and foreign travel/study at the University of Virginia.
